The second couple comes from Philadelphia. Sidney has arrived the night before his wife, Diana. He wakes in the morning to find, lying next to him, a very drunken prostitute whom his brother has procured and paid for. He tries in vain to hide her passed-out body before his wife appears. The third couple, from London, is in town for the Academy Awards. Diana Nichols has been nominated for best actress and is nervous beyond words. Her husband, Sidney, once an actor, is now an antiques dealer in London, but his life seems to revolve around his wife. There's one small problem: Sidney prefers men to women. In the last segment, two couples from Chicago are vacationing together. Everything goes wrong when Beth suffers a tennis injury. The two men try to transport her from chair to bed. As they keep dropping her, she howls in pain. One by one, they are all hurt in one form or another and the cast is given a very physical but hilarious workout.
